CODE COMMITTEE

The Code Committee meets Monday mornings from 9:30AM-11:00AM in the Small Card Room (SCR) in the Office Building and are available to answer questions & provide guidance necessary for all exterior project requests. You can also call 732-244-8686 Ext.#220 and leave a message.

An approved Zoning & Construction

Application, including all specifications necessary for the proposed project, as well as a Holiday Heights Project Permit, are required before any work can begin. We continue to require approval for any exterior project before work begins. Please note: A Berkeley Township permit will be required when applicable. A copy of the Berkeley Township permit, as well as the Holiday Heights Project Permit, are required to be posted prior to the start of any work.

The Code Committee continues to process applications for exterior projects as quickly as possible. The expected time for review and approval is approximately two (2) weeks. We ask for your patience and your consideration of this timeline when planning all projects.

RESERVING A DATE FOR EVENTS, MEETINGS OR TRIPS

To reserve a room in one of our buildings for any event, meeting or when scheduling a trip, you must first contact the office for available dates. A Calendar Appointment Form must be completed for all reservations. The Recreation Chairperson and the Liaison Director for Recreation must approve all requests.

KITCHEN SIZE PLASTIC BAGS

Please be aware kitchen size plastic bags containing refuse are not allowed to be placed at the curb or stored on a Homeowners' property. Violations will result in fines. Please cooperate to help protect our Community.

<u>MAIL DROP BOX</u> – For your convenience, when the office is closed, you can drop off your association dues payments or any other documents, in our convenient mail drop box located outside the front door to the Office Building.

RELOCATING-If you are planning on relocating to another address, selling your home, leaving your home vacant or have any other changes regarding your Home/Owner status, please notify the office so your information can be updated in our master files.

GARAGE/ESTATE SALE PERMITS

As per the Berkeley Township Municipal Code: Chapter 5-7.4: "The assessed owner of a property may have two (2) garage or yard sales per year. Each sale may not consist of more than two (2) consecutive days. A Berkeley Township permit is required to be obtained for each yard sale conducted. There is no fee for the first permit. There will be a five-dollar (\$5.00) fee for the second permit. Permits are only available from the Berkeley Township Municipal Clerk."

NO DUMPING IN THE BASINS!

<u>DUMPSTERS / PODS</u> – Contact the Code Committee before planning to have a dumpster or storage pod placed in your driveway. Dumpsters and pods are not allowed on any street within the Holiday Heights Community.

<u>PARKING</u> - Commercial vehicles are not permitted in your driveway. Parking on your lawn is also not permitted.

<u>COMPLAINTS</u> All complaints must be submitted in writing to the Code Committee ,with your name, address and signature. All written complaints will remain anonymous. You can obtain these forms from the Holiday Heights website or from the Clubhouse office.

CONTRACTOR SIGNS

No Contractor signs are to be left on lawns following completion of work.

CURBING YOUR PET-All pets must be confined within the Owner's Living Unit except when being walked on a hand-held leash, not to exceed six feet (6') in length. Pet Owners are permitted to use the easement/patch of grass between the sidewalk and the curb. Walking pets in the street is discouraged due to safety issues for Owners and pets. Pet Owners shall keep their pets off other Owners' properties, Clubhouse Grounds and Common Properties. All Pet Owners must collect their pet's feces. Failure to pick up after your pet is a Holiday Heights fineable offense for each occurrence. There will also be an additional fine for each infraction under the Berkeley Township Ordinance (05-25-OAB-3) We expect all pet Owners to be respectful of other Owners and in return, we expect Owners to show the same respect for pet Owners.

News from the Board

Last month we discussed Homeowner/Residents Rights. This month we will discuss the "Rights" and "Responsibilities" of the Association.

As we mentioned last month, creating and sustaining a sense of Community is best achieved when Homeowners, non-owners and Association Leaders recognize and embrace each others rights and responsibilities.

Many of the Homeowners responsibilities are mirrored by the rights associated with those of the community leaders. The Association leaders expect owners to meet their financial obligations to the Community, know and comply with the governing documents and rules and regulations, by staying informed by reading the Associations news (Courier) and by attending Association meetings. The Board expects to be treated respectfully and honestly, be able to conduct meetings in a positive and constructive manner, and to have their personal privacy at home and during leisure time in the Community respected.

The Association's responsibilities are many, most presented in the governing documents. To mention a few; fiduciary duties, discretion in a manner they reasonably believe to be in the best interest of the Community, exercise sound judgment and management practices, and balance the needs and obligations of the Community and the Homeowners. The Board should encourage input from Homeowners and Residents, conduct business in a transparent manner, allow Homeowners access to appropriate records, and provide Homeowners and Residents with a process to appeal decisions affecting their non-routine financial responsibilities or property rights.

Homeowner/Resident rights and responsibilities go hand-in-hand with the Association's rights and responsibility making for a better Community. Balancing Community Civility, Homeowner rights and responsibilities, and the Association's rights and responsibilities can only lead to a better more pleasant Holiday Heights.

ATTENTION TO HOMEOWNERS WHO PLAN ON SELLING YOUR HOME

If you are Holiday Heights Homeowner and you are planning on selling your home, you must notify the Clubhouse Office once it is under contract with your Realtor.

As a Seller, it is your obligation that you leave the (4) Badges (2 yellow/2 green) and your 2013 white homeowner handbook of the Bylaws, Covenants & Restrictions & Rules & Regulations in your home for the Buyer(s).

Buyer(s) must register with the Clubhouse Office by obtaining a Resale Packet that consists of several documents as well as one document pertaining to you, as the Seller.

Other requirements include two forms of identification from the buyer(s) at the time of registration.

All documents from our Resale Packet must be returned fully completed and signed ten (10) days prior to your anticipated closing date. Once the documents are approved by the office staff, age verification is done verifying that the Buyer(s) are in fact 55 years of age or older. An **Age Approval Letter** to the Township of Berkeley is prepared by the office staff and must be brought to the Township by the Seller and/or the Seller's Realtor in order for them to release the Certificate of Occupancy.

If you have any questions and/or need additional information regarding the resale process of selling your home, you can contact the Office Staff at 732-244-8686 between 9:00AM-2:00PM, Monday-Friday.

These procedures must be followed in its entirety.



GRASS CUTTING POLICY

Sprinkler heads are the Owner's responsibility

All Grass Cutting Issues must be reported to the HOA Office in writing, using the Lawn Complaint Form (forms are available at the HOA Office or on our website at (holidayheights.org). Please do not call the Lawn Contractor or a Director. A complaint form must be filled out for all complaints. No complaint form filled out will void the complaint.

Damage to property such as siding, fences, borders and sprinklers will be addressed in a timely manner. Our contractor has staff to handle these repairs. Should you have damage, please take responsible measures to prevent further damage. All complaints will be inspected by a director to determine the cause and action to be taken. Repairs made by homeowners prior to the Director's inspection and without authorization by the Board, will not be reimbursed. Please ensure the cutters have a clear path and your sprinkler heads are down on grass cutting days. Sprinkler heads damaged due to heads being raised during the cut cycle will not be repaired by the Lawn Contractor. If you have heads that do not retract, place red do-not cut flags around the head until you can have it repaired, also confirm all ground panels are secured.

Damage to lawns such as scalping and ruts will be considered on a case-by-case basis. Some will grow back without intervention. The majority of ruts are caused by the ground being over saturated due to recent rain and/or over watering by the sprinklers. The driver is most likely unaware of the saturated ground until it is too late. Ruts caused by Homeowners over watering their lawn will not be repaired by the Lawn Contractor. Please check your side and rear yards as needed to ensure the ground is not over saturated. If you find there are areas that are over saturated, please obtain red flags from the HOA Office and circle the saturated areas so the mowers know not to cut that area.

No Cut Signs are a violation and are subject to a fine if placed on your lawn.

"No Cut" flags are available in the HOA Office for those not wanting the Association to cut their grass. You will need to fill out the No Lawn Cut form and you will be given flags at the HOA Office.

Under normal soil conditions, grass requires only ½ to 1 inch of water per week. Our soils are generally wetter due to the high-water table and type of soil; therefore, discuss this with your sprinkler contractor and ask them to adjust the frequency and run times on your sprinkler system for roughly ¾ inch per week. Also ask them to adjust your system as needed throughout the watering season. Remember the water requirements for the area between the homes may be less than the front and back, work with your neighbors to establish a watering schedule. Watering your lawn every day is not needed unless it is a new seeding.

Contractor - Lawn Damage Disclosure

Sprinkler Heads –It is the homeowner's responsibility to ensure the sprinkler heads are operating correctly and are down during the cut cycle. If there are raised sprinkler heads, they should be circled with do not cut flags to avoid damage. Concrete sprinkler collars cause significant damage to the lawn cutting equipment and should be removed. The Lawn Contractor will not repair damaged sprinklers due to raised sprinkler heads.

Sprinkler Valve Boxes and Well Cover Boxes – These boxes should be installed slightly below or at ground level. Covers are to be fastened to the boxes with set screws, to prevent lids from popping up and causing damage to mowers and landscaper personnel. Aged and deteriorated lids, should be checked and replaced periodically because they have a tendency of cracking. The Contractor will not be liable for damages if the above guidelines are not followed. The Contractor is not responsible for damages to Verizon or other utility boxes.

Home Exterior – Homes should have a 12 inches barrier separating the home and its entities from the grass. Homes without the 12 inches barrier must have its siding and/or home exterior covering at least 12 inches in height or more from ground level. Contractor will not be liable for siding damage or home damage if guidelines are not followed.

Lawn and Landscape Décor, Lighting and Mailboxes – All should have a 12-inch barrier between them and the grass areas. All wires need to be buried to avoid being cut.

Ruts & Damaged Turf –Damage to lawns such as scalping and ruts will be considered on a case-by-case basis. The majority of ruts are caused by the ground being over saturated due to recent rain and/or over watering by the sprinkler system settings. The driver is most likely unaware of the saturated ground until it is too late. Ruts caused by Homeowners over watering their lawn will not be repaired by the Lawn Contractor. Please check your side and rear yards as needed to ensure the ground is not over saturated. If you find there are areas that are over saturated, please obtain red DO NOT CUT flags from the HOA Office and circle the saturated areas so the mower operators know not to cut that area.

Lawn Area – Homeowners are to make sure the lawn is free and clear of stones, debris and personal property which can become a projectile or cause damage or injury. (Example: Garden hoses, dog leashes, tools, etc.) Any personal property should be a minimum of 12 inches away from the grass areas to prevent damage. All grass areas are to be level with proper soil and grass installation. Grind all stumps to ground level, chips removed and soil installed. All ground covering (mulch, stone, etc.) should be separated from the grass by a barrier, because if mixed in the grass they can become projectiles and can cause damage and personal injury. The Contractor will not be liable for repair or replacement of personal property if debris/ground covering is the cause of damage or injury.

Repairs – Any reported damages by a homeowner will be reviewed by the Association's Grass Liaison (Director) to determine if the Contractor is liable under the guidelines in the Contract Damage Disclosure. All Grass Cutting Issues must be reported to the HOA Office in writing using the Lawn Complaint Form. Failure to complete a complaint form, voids the complaint. Lawn Complaint Forms forwarded to the Contractor for repair will be reviewed within 7 days of receipt and repaired within 10 days after reviewing. The Grass Liaison will be notified if damages will take longer to repair, which could happen due to circumstances beyond their control.

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Recipe

Pepperoni Pizza Bites

Ingredients: Pizza Dough 1 package Pizza sauce Muffin tins Pepperoni cut into small pieces Mozzarella and grated parmesan cheese

Divide the dough into 12 pieces. (24 pieces if you are using the mini muffin tins) Roll each piece into a ball and press it into a greased muffin tin. Bake the dough for 15 minutes at 375* and remove it from the oven. The dough will rise a bit. Gently press the dough down in the middle of each cup to create a small well. Top each with sauce, mozzarella, pepperoni, and parmesan cheese. Bake the bites for 3 more minutes until the cheese is melted. Let them cool. Enjoy!

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HOLIDAY HEIGHTS FIRST AID SQUAD

The Holiday Heights First Aid Squad was formed in 1987 to serve the residents of Holiday Heights. We currently work a 12-hour shift from 7 am until 1900 (7 pm). The days we work are Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday & Thursday.

Each crew consists of an EMT or Certified Assessor, a driver/ lifter and an information specialist. Both of our ambulances are equipped with hydraulic stretchers that lift the patient into the ambulance.

There are 3 requirements to become a squad member: having a valid driver's license, getting CPR certified, and being able to get on and off the ambulance unassisted.

All crew members are certified in CPR and the use of an AED. Classes are provided in the squad

building, and all costs are covered by the squad. Members that want to be certified as an Assessor or EMT may take the required class at no cost. Drivers attend a CIVO or Advance Emergency Drivers class. Additionally, there are other classes offered by the town or County, and attendance is voluntary.

Uniform shirts and jackets are provided by the Squad. You will need black pants and black shoes.

Most Crews work two or three days per month, and we also have one mandatory meeting per month, usually the fourth Wednesday of the month.
