CODE COMMITTEE

The Code Committee meets Monday mornings from 9:30AM-11:00AM in the Small Card Room (SCR) in the Office Building and are available to answer questions & provide guidance necessary for all exterior project requests. You can also call 732-244-8686 Ext.#220 and leave a message.

An approved Zoning & Construction Application, including all specifications necessary for the proposed project, as well as a Holiday Heights Project Permit, are required before any work can begin. We continue to require approval for any exterior project before work begins. Please note: A Berkeley Township permit will be required when applicable. A copy of the Berkeley Township permit, as well as the Holiday Heights Project Permit, are required to be posted prior to the start of any work.

The Code Committee continues to process applications for exterior projects as quickly as possible. The expected time for review and approval is approximately two (2) weeks. We ask for your patience and your consideration of this timeline when planning all projects.

RESERVING A DATE FOR EVENTS, MEETINGS OR TRIPS

To reserve a room in one of our buildings for any event, meeting or when scheduling a trip, you must first contact the office for available dates. A Calendar Appointment Form must be completed for all reservations. The Recreation Chairperson and the Liaison Director for Recreation must approve all requests.

KITCHEN SIZE PLASTIC BAGS

Please be aware kitchen size plastic bags containing refuse are not allowed to be placed at the curb or stored on a Homeowners' property. Violations will result in fines. Please cooperate to help protect our community.

MAIL DROP BOX - For your convenience, when the office is closed, you can drop off your association dues payments or any other documents, in our convenient mail drop box located outside the front door to the Office Building.

EMERGENCY CONTACT INFORMATION

It is very important that the office has a valid phone number and an emergency contact number on file. If your information has changed, please call the office at 732-244-8686. It only takes a minute to update and it very well may save your life in case of an emergency!

RELOCATING-If you are planning on relocating to another address, selling your home, leaving your home vacant or have any other changes regarding your Home/Owner status, please notify the office so your information can be updated in our master files.

GARAGE/ESTATE SALE PERMITS

As per the Berkelev Township Municipal Code: Chapter 5-7.4: "The assessed owner of a property may have two (2) garage or yard sales per year. Each sale may not consist of more than two (2) consecutive days. A Berkeley Township permit is required to be obtained for each yard sale conducted. There is no fee for the first permit. There will be a five-dollar (\$5.00) fee for the second permit. Permits are only available from the Berkeley Township Municipal Clerk."

NO DUMPING IN THE BASINS!

DUMPSTERS / PODS – Contact the Code Committee before planning to have a dumpster or storage pod placed in your driveway. Dumpsters and pods are not allowed on any street within the Holiday Heights Community.

PARKING - Commercial vehicles are not permitted in your driveway. Parking on your lawn is also not permitted.

COMPLAINTS All complaints must be submitted in writing to the Code Committee, with your name, address and signature. All written complaints will remain anonymous. You can obtain these forms from the Holiday Heights website or from the Clubhouse office.

CONTRACTOR SIGNS

No Contractor signs are to be left on lawns following completion of work.

CURBING YOUR PET-All pets must be confined within the Owner's Living Unit except when being walked on a hand-held leash, not to exceed six feet (6') in length. Pet Owners are permitted to use the easement/patch of grass between the sidewalk and the curb. Walking pets in the street is discouraged due to safety issues for Owners and pets. Pet Owners shall keep their pets off other Owners' properties. Clubhouse Grounds and Common Properties. All Pet Owners must collect their pet's feces. Failure to pick up after your pet is a Holiday Heights fineable offense for each occurrence. There will also be an additional fine for each infraction under the Berkeley Township Ordinance (05-25-OAB-3) We expect all pet Owners to be respectful of other Owners and in return, we expect Owners to show the same respect for pet Owners.

News from the Board

Last month we discussed the makeup of volunteers in our Community. This month we will discuss what it means to be a volunteer. We find a lot of members are afraid of the word "volunteer". They feel they don't have the time or ability to volunteer. But when you look at it, volunteering does not mean a lifelong commitment. In many cases, it could mean only a few hours per month or helping at an event for a few hours. You don't have to lead a committee, run an event, or handle an activity to be a volunteer. It may only be sitting at a table to sell tickets, helping decorate tables for a social event, running out to a store to buy supplies for an event or activity, helping in the kitchen, putting books back on shelves in the library, helping with pool chairs or planting flowers around the pool. There are many "small" jobs you could volunteer to do that would make it easier for committee members with their activities or events. It's great to live in a Community that offers many activities and events but it comes with a cost. Some of the cost is time and effort. Some are meeting new friends who you may be working with and participating in making this a better Community. The next time you hear a call for volunteers think about getting involved and starting a new adventure. The Community will appreciate it.

President's Message

Among the keys to successful governance of residential communities is continuity. The most basic of democratically elected HOA boards are the custodians of their community's welfare, success, and continued operation. Over time, the experience and insight accrued by board members/directors are the compass and rudder that steer and stabilize the community.

That being said, as board service is a volunteer opportunity, board members do not serve indefinitely in accordance with our governing documents resulting in some very experienced board members being replaced through attrition, term expiration, or the realization it simply wasn't what they thought life on the board was as they expected it to be. In some cases, an entire board (or, as in our case this year) the majority of board members may be replaced or vacated). In either scenario, successful integration of new board members and early disclosure of clearer understanding of what board member responsibility involves is crucial for the continued health of the community.

It's always good to have "new blood" but the history and mechanics of the community and knowledge of that history firsthand is also important. That's what you lose when replacing board members, some of whom only have chosen to fulfill one term and leave, taking that limited experience with them and not passing on what they have learned. Not knowing the history of the property, especially the mechanicals, warranties, service contracts, etc, can become a real problem which is easily solved with staggered terms which we indeed have. Having experienced board members remaining year after year to serve as a point of reference for newcomers is critical. However, the worst potential situation is Holiday Heights' current position, as we are sweeping 5 board members out opening a huge void for potential new board members without having any potential knowledge and or experience in any area of HOA community management and may or may not have even attended even an HOA meeting or served on a committee. Less experienced members, often well-meaning and curious, are less versed in board procedures and responsibilities which may derail their immediate progress in acclimating to board services as we have experienced in the past. The upcoming election is the most important election Holiday Heights has faced in its' past history and must be taken seriously.

Many states now require any potential board candidate to take a course to qualify to be a board member. In New Jersey the Radburn Act has changed many of our HOA election rules and allows any resident in good standing to be eligible to run for the HOA Board. Good intentions and curiosity simply aren't enough. Commitment, involvement, fiduciary responsibilities, dedication, experience, availability, knowledge, etc...all components of necessary qualities.

In many cases, it will only take one (1) vote to seat a potential candidate to your board. Think about it. You must know who you are voting for and why. This board is planning several opportunities this year prior to election to meet with anyone considering candidacy to the board to answer any questions relating to responsibilities and expectations of a board member, we are giving homeowners opportunities to meet candidates prior to voting to ask questions of the candidates, and finally the knowledge that HH cannot leave the job of 7 board members to so few as it has been the rare case scenario we have experienced this past year.

Top Ten Need to Know Guidelines When Considering Becoming a Board Member

1. Commit your time.

If you agree to be a board member, make your service a priority. Expect to attend as many meetings both day/night and weekends as necessary. Be involved. Be available. This is not a social opportunity! There is always much to do.

2. Know the Rules & Regulations, Budget, and Buildings & Grounds.

Read, reread, and be well versed in our governing documents and prior minutes. The documents are our foundation. Read all relevant materials before meetings so you're prepared to discuss issues and make sound decisions. Know budgetary requirements and restraints. Know the buildings physically. Know what it takes to maintain the buildings, landscaping, maintenance, etc.

3. Remember your fiduciary duties.

Recognize that board members operate in a fiduciary capacity, which means you're entrusted with the operation of the association and doing what's in the association's best interest, not always in the interest of the owners' special interests. It isn't always easy.

4. Know the professionals you're dealing with.

Be on a first-name basis with the Administrative Manager and Staff, CPA, and attorney. When these names are referred to in letters, reports, and/or conversations during meetings you will be aware of who they are.

5. Always comply with the governing documents and relevant laws.

6. Use competitive bidding.

The easiest way to avoid the appearance of impropriety in association contracts is to seek competitive bids for all projects over a certain limit as set in governing documents

7. Work within the association's framework and refrain from unilateral action.

Discuss board business only at board meetings. "What happens in the Board Room, Stays in the Board Room"! **Remember, the board speaks with one voice**. If there is a board decision you disagree with, once it is made, support it.

8. Always exhibit professional behavior.

Treat your constituents with respect and decency. Have an open dialogue between the board and association members. You would be surprised how many problems don't happen! Don't harass association members or residents and refrain from defaming anyone in the community despite their taunts.

9. Maintain confidentiality of association matters when it's appropriate.

Never discuss board actions and decisions about litigation outside board meetings – ever.

10. Promptly disclose conflicts of interest, and take immediate action when one arises.

Recuse yourself immediately!

Declarations and Bylaws

On or about **June 24th** the Holiday Heights Board of Directors distributed to all Homeowners the 2024 revisions of our governing documents for your review and approval: **The Declarations of Covenants and Restrictions and the Bylaws.**

The prior Holiday Heights Handbook Declaration and the Bylaws (White Book) was distributed in 2013. Since then, three Amendment changes were made, and in 2017 the Radburn Act and additional requirements enacted in 2020 required multiple major changes to the Bylaws, all of which are now incorporated into this 2024 revision. These amendments are being made to clarify many areas, bring our documents into compliance with current laws, and address several issues new to our Community.

For your convenience, informational meeting dates will be held to address your questions and concerns: Saturday, July 6th at 2 pm, and Tuesday, July 9th at 2 pm. All will be held in the clubhouse auditorium.

All ballots must be returned by 5:00 pm on July 15th.

The three (3) candidates with the highest number of votes will fill the three-year terms, and the remaining vacancies will be filled by the candidates who receive the next highest number of votes. These open positions must be filled by Owners in Good Standing.

□ A Candidate shall run as an individual and not as part of a slate.

September 11th - Ballots will be publicly tallied in the Auditorium at 10:00 am and results Posted

September 12th - New Director Swearing-In Ceremony

Responsibilities of Office

- 1. To read, understand, abide by, and uphold the Certificate of Incorporation, Bylaws, Declaration, and the Rules, including the Directors Code of Conduct.
- 2. To understand and agree that a Director is elected as one of seven (7) equal Directors by the Owners of the Association and that each Director has an equal voice in the affairs of the Board and the conduct of the Association
- 3. To attend a voluntary pre-orientation meeting with the Election Committee Chairperson and an Officer of the current Board to provide a full understanding of a Director's roles and responsibilities.
- 4. To aid and assist in the ongoing work of the Board and the management of the Association and to accept a fair share of the tasks deemed necessary by the Board to accomplish same.
- 5. To accept the Direct Responsibility associated with facilities, staff, and duties/tasks related to Board obligations.
- 6. To accept the role of Liaison Director to one or more Association committees and the work it entails.
- 7. To understand and agree that no member of the Board shall receive compensation from the Association, except for reimbursement of legitimate expenses incurred, with the prior approval of the Board, in the performance of duties and obligations as a member of the Board.
- 8. To understand and agree that a Director may not speak for or commit the Board to any action, purchase, or position without proper authority of the other members of the Board
- 9. To agree and accept that if a purchase is made or work is authorized by a Board member without approval or ratification by a quorum of the Board, the Board is under no obligation to pay and instead the Director who authorized to commit the Association would be personally responsible and the Association shall be defended, indemnified and held harmless by the unauthorized Director for all claims arising from and relating to such unauthorized purchase or work.
- 10. To understand and agree that a Director may take a public position on any subject but shall at all times identify the position as their own personal opinion and not that of the Board or the Association as a whole.
- 11. To agree and accept the responsibility to attend Board and Homeowners meetings as scheduled. Three (3) unexcused absences within a three-month period or three (3) consecutive unexcused absences may be grounds for suspension or dismissal from the Board.

Qualifications for Office

- 1. A candidate for the Board shall be an Owner in Good Standing as defined in N.J.S.A.45:22A-23r.
- 2. Being an Owner in Good Standing as defined in N.J.S.A. 45:22A-23r shall be the sole criterion for an Owner to be eligible to run as a nominee, be elected to the Board, and serve as a Director of the Board
- 3. Not more than one Owner of a Lot shall run for or serve on the Board simultaneously with another Owner of the same Lot.
- 4. A Director shall not serve, pro-tem or otherwise, as a chairperson or member of either standing or "ad hoc" committee, or as an officer of any club in the Holiday Heights Community and this shall not be subject to grandfathering.

GRASS CUTTING POLICY

Sprinkler heads are the Owner's responsibility

All Grass Cutting Issues must be reported to the HOA Office in writing, using the Lawn Complaint Form (forms are available at the HOA Office or on our website at (holidayheights.org). Please do not call the Lawn Contractor or a Director. A complaint form must be filled out for all complaints. No complaint form filled out will void the complaint.

Damage to property such as siding, fences, borders and sprinklers will be addressed in a timely manner. Our contractor has staff to handle these repairs. Should you have damage, please take responsible measures to prevent further damage. All complaints will be inspected by a director to determine the cause and action to be taken. Repairs made by homeowners prior to the Director's inspection and without authorization by the Board, will not be reimbursed. Please ensure the cutters have a clear path and your sprinkler heads are down on grass cutting days. Sprinkler heads damaged due to headsbeing raised during the cut cycle will not be repaired by the Lawn Contractor. If you have heads that do not retract, place red do-not cut flags around the head until you can have it repaired, also confirm all ground panels are secured.

Damage to lawns such as scalping and ruts will be considered on a case-by-case basis. Some will grow back without intervention. The majority of ruts are caused by the ground being over saturated due to recent rain and/or over watering by the sprinklers. The driver is most likely unaware of the saturated ground until it is too late. Ruts caused by Homeowners over watering their lawn will not be repaired by the Lawn Contractor. Please check your side and rear yards as needed to ensure the ground is not over saturated. If you find there are areas that are over saturated, please obtain red flags from the HOA Office and circle the saturated areas so the mowers know not to cut that area.

No Cut Signs are a violation and are subject to a fine if placed on your lawn.

"No Cut" flags are available in the HOA Office for those not wanting the Association to cut their grass. You will need to fill out the No Lawn Cut form and you will be given flags at the HOA Office.

Under normal soil conditions, grass requires only $\frac{1}{2}$ to 1 inch of water per week. Our soils are generally wetter due to the high-water table and type of soil; therefore, discuss this with your sprinkler contractor and ask them to adjust the frequency and run times on your sprinkler system for roughly $\frac{3}{4}$ inch per week. Also ask them to adjust your system as needed throughout the watering season. Remember the water requirements for the area between the homes may be less than the front and back, work with your neighbors to establish a watering schedule. Watering your lawn every day is not needed unless it is a new seeding.

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



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
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Women's Club News
