CODE COMMITTEE

The Code Committee meets Monday mornings from 9:30AM-11:00AM in the Small Card Room (SCR) in the Office Building and are available to answer questions & provide guidance necessary for all exterior project requests. You can also call 732-244-8686 Ext.#220 and leave a message.

An approved Zoning & Construction

Application, including all specifications necessary for the proposed project, as well as a Holiday Heights Project Permit, are required before any work can begin. We continue to require approval for any exterior project before work begins. Please note: A Berkeley Township permit will be required when applicable. A copy of the Berkeley Township permit, as well as the Holiday Heights Project Permit, are required to be posted prior to the start of any work.

The Code Committee continues to process applications for exterior projects as quickly as possible. The expected time for review and approval is approximately two (2) weeks. We ask for your patience and your consideration of this timeline when planning all projects.

RESERVING A DATE FOR EVENTS, MEETINGS **OR TRIPS**

To reserve a room in one of our buildings for any event, meeting or when scheduling a trip, you must first contact the office for available dates. A Calendar Appointment Form must be completed for all reservations. The Recreation Chairperson and the Liaison Director for Recreation must approve all requests.

KITCHEN SIZE PLASTIC BAGS

Please be aware kitchen size plastic bags containing refuse are not allowed to be placed at the curb or stored on a Homeowners' property. Violations will result in fines. Please cooperate to help protect our Community.

MAIL DROP BOX – For your convenience, when the office is closed, you can drop off your association dues payments or any other documents, in our convenient mail drop box located outside the front door to the Office Building.

EMERGENCY CONTACT INFORMATION

It is very important that the office has a valid phone number and an emergency contact number on file. If your information has changed, please call the office at 732-244-8686. It only takes a minute to update and it very well may save your life in case of an emergency!

your Home/Owner status, please notify the office so your information can be updated in our master files.

GARAGE/ESTATE SALE PERMITS

As per the Berkeley Township Municipal Code: Chapter 5-7.4: "The assessed owner of a property may have two (2) garage or yard sales per year. Each sale may not consist of more than two (2) consecutive days. A Berkeley Township permit is required to be obtained for each yard sale conducted. There is no fee for the first permit. There will be a five-dollar (\$5.00) fee for the second permit. Permits are only available from the Berkeley Township Municipal Clerk."

NO DUMPING IN THE BASINS!

<u>DUMPSTERS / PODS</u> – Contact the Code Committee before planning to have a dumpster or storage pod placed in your driveway. Dumpsters and pods are not allowed on any street within the Holiday Heights Community.

SPEEDING IN OUR COMMUNITY

The speed limit is **25 MPH** in residential areas. Those of you who have children living with you and who have the privilege of living here in our 55+ community are racing through our streets. Please tell them to **SLOWDOWN** and to **STOP AT STOP SIGNS**. Every day there are near misses in our community. It's not worth your life or someone else's life. **PLEASE SLOW DOWN!!**

PARKING - Commercial vehicles are not permitted in your driveway. Parking on your lawn is also not permitted.

<u>COMPLAINTS</u> All complaints must be submitted in writing to the Code Committee ,with your name, address and signature. All written complaints will remain anonymous. You can obtain these forms from the Holiday Heights website or from the Clubhouse office.

CONTRACTOR SIGNS

No Contractor signs are to be left on lawns following completion of work.

CURBING YOUR PET-All pets must be confined within the Owner's Living Unit except when being walked on a hand-held leash, not to exceed six feet (6') in length. Pet Owners are permitted to use the easement/patch of grass between the sidewalk and the curb. Walking pets in the street is discouraged due to safety issues for Owners and pets. Pet Owners shall keep their pets off other Owners' properties, Clubhouse Grounds and Common Properties. All Pet Owners must collect their pet's feces. Failure to pick up after your pet is a Holiday Heights fineable

offense for each occurrence. There will also be an additional fine for each infraction under the Berkeley Township Ordinance (05-25-OAB-3) We expect all pet Owners to be respectful of other Owners and in return, we expect Owners to show the same respect for pet Owners.

News from the Board

September was a busy month with the election and the start of a new fiscal year. We have five new Directors eager to get started in governing our community. There was some discouraging news: the previous Board had to raise dues to comply with a bill passed earlier this year concerning facility maintenance and reserve funding. Many of our members are now becoming aware of what a reserve study is and how it is funded. As with any new topic, there are some misconceptions associated with it.

- 1. Thinking it is not necessary to do and update the Reserve Study. Every year the conditions of our assets change as well as the cost of replacing or repairing them. Our Reserve funding must keep up with these conditions. Reserve contributions are a large budget item and it makes sense to plan and be prepared to handle maintenance.
- 2. Thinking delaying a project will save the Association some money. Timely repairs and replacement projects can go smoothly if the funds are available. It is not uncommon to see projects increase in cost from one year to the next because of deferred maintenance and delays causing unnecessary higher costs for our homeowners.
- 3. Thinking "It's not my problem, it's a future problem someone else can deal with". Roofs, asphalt, windows, etc, all start to deteriorate the day they are first installed. Reserve contributions offset future expenses and when the time to repair or replace them comes due the funds are available with no "one-time" assessments necessary.
- 4. Thinking contributing 50% less than our required contribution each year will result in the Association's reserve fund being 50% less than when it is required. It takes a significant amount of cash to provide for the timely repairs and replacements of the Association's components. But it takes 10 to 15% more to add some "margin" to your reserve to be on track and be fully funded when the project comes due. Cutting reserve contributions dooms the Association to having inadequate cash, leading to deferred maintenance, special assessments, and a host of other problems.

It is wonderful that we have a full Board to start this fiscal year and I expect, as a team, we will work hard to meet the community's expectations. Looking ahead, this Board will work to keep our members informed on what is happening on the Board and in the community and why. They will also be very watchful concerning the community's financials and attempt to keep spending under control. As the year progresses, some key components in our facilities must be addressed to improve the Association's efficiency and safety. These will be addressed and covered at homeowner meetings. As always, if there are any suggestions or concerns you have as a member of this Association and community, please do not hesitate to bring them forward so our Directors can address them. The key to doing this is to attend the Open Board and Homeowner meetings. There you will hear and learn what is happening and why. It is also the place to address the Board with your concerns and suggestions. Looking forward to seeing you at these meetings.

GRASS CUTTING POLICY

Sprinkler heads are the Owner's responsibility

All Grass Cutting Issues must be reported to the HOA Office in writing, using the Lawn Complaint Form (forms are available at the HOA Office or on our website at (holidayheights.org). Please do not call the Lawn Contractor or a Director. A complaint form must be filled out for all complaints. No complaint form filled out will void the complaint.

Damage to property such as siding, fences, borders and sprinklers will be addressed in a timely manner. Our contractor has staff to handle these repairs. Should you have damage, please take responsible measures to prevent further damage. All complaints will be inspected by a director to determine the cause and action to be taken. Repairs made by homeowners prior to the Director's inspection and without authorization by the Board, will not be reimbursed. Please ensure the cutters have a clear path and your sprinkler heads are down on grass cutting days. Sprinkler heads damaged due to heads being raised during the cut cycle will not be repaired by the Lawn Contractor. If you have heads that do not retract, place red do-not cut flags around the head until you can have it repaired, also confirm all ground panels are secured.

Damage to lawns such as scalping and ruts will be considered on a case-by-case basis. Some will grow back without intervention. The majority of ruts are caused by the ground being over saturated due to recent rain and/or over watering by the sprinklers. The driver is most likely unaware of the saturated ground until it is too late. Ruts caused by Homeowners over watering their lawn will not be repaired by the Lawn Contractor. Please check your side and rear yards as needed to ensure the ground is not over saturated. If you find there are areas that are over saturated, please obtain red flags from the HOA Office and circle the saturated areas so the mowers know not to cut that area.

No Cut Signs are a violation and are subject to a fine if placed on your lawn.

"No Cut" flags are available in the HOA Office for those not wanting the Association to cut their grass. You will need to fill out the No Lawn Cut form and you will be given flags at the HOA Office.

Under normal soil conditions, grass requires only ½ to 1 inch of water per week. Our soils are generally wetter due to the high-water table and type of soil; therefore, discuss this with your sprinkler contractor and ask them to adjust the frequency and run times on your sprinkler system for roughly ¾ inch per week. Also ask them to adjust your system as needed throughout the watering season. Remember the water requirements for the area between the homes may be less than the front and back, work with your neighbors to establish a watering schedule. Watering your lawn every day is not needed unless it is a new seeding.



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



KIRMS PHOTOGRAPHY Autumn Colors

Autumn is here and I'm looking forward to photographing this year's fall foliage. The leaves are starting to change. Hopefully the colors this year will be spectacular.

Before the colors are at their peak I look for individual trees that have great color. I also scout out areas that I think will look great at peak time so I'll be ready when the leaves finally turn. I prefer areas that have the trees reflected in water.

Check out the farm markets for some colorful shots and don't forget the cranberry harvest. Fallen leaves make interesting patterns, so don't forget to look down. Rolls of hay in the fields also make nice images.

A great way to enhance your images is using a polarizing filter. This filter works the same as polarizing sunglasses – it is designed to cut glare and reflections. Removing the glare from the leaves makes the colors brighter and more saturated. Simply rotate the polarizing filter until the sky or leaves are at their darkest.

Fall Foliage images are best shot on days when there is no wind. By scouting a great location ahead of time, using a polarizing filter, and applying good rules of composition you'll get some fantastic shots of this autumn's spectacular show.



October is Breast Cancer Awareness month

Every year breast cancer accounts for approximately 30% of all new cancer cases in U.S. women. The median age at the time of breast cancer diagnosis is 62. Don't think "I'm 70 years old now, I can't get breast cancer", or I am only 45. I'm too young to get breast cancer." Although rare, 1 out of 8 invasive breast cancers are diagnosed in women younger than 45, or "I am a man, I don't have to be concerned about breast cancer." Once again, although rare, the average lifetime risk of a man getting breast cancer is 1 in 726 men.

Know your risks.

Talk to both sides of your family to learn your family health history. If you have tested positive for the mutated BRCA 1 or BRACA 2 gene, you are at a higher risk of developing breast cancer.

Get screened. Have a mammogram every year starting at age 40 if you are at average risk.

Know what normal is for you. See your doctor if you notice any of these changes: lump, hard knot or thickening inside the breast or underarm area; swelling, warmth, redness, or darkening of the breast; change in the size or shape of the breast; dimpling or puckering of the skin; itchy, scaly sore, rash, discharge, or pulling in or on your nipple. Take note of a new pain in one spot that does not go away.

Make healthy lifestyle choices. Maintain a healthy weight. Make exercise part of your routine. Limit alcohol intake. Limit menopausal hormone use. During childbearing years, breastfeed if you can.

Ignore the MYTH thinking you are exempt from breast cancer if you don't have a family history or are otherwise healthy.

Breast cancer can recur! Remain vigilant in getting your yearly screening!
