CODE COMMITTEE

The Code Committee meets Monday mornings from 9:30AM-11:00AM in the Small Card Room (SCR) in the Office Building and are available to answer questions & provide guidance necessary for all exterior project requests. You can also call 732-244-8686 Ext.#220 and leave a message.

An approved Exterior Project Application Form, in-

cluding all specifications necessary for the proposed project, as well as a Holiday Heights Project Permit are required before any work can begin. We continue to require approval for any exterior project before work begins. Please note: A Berkeley Township permit will be required when applicable. A copy of the Berkeley Township permit, as well as the Holiday Heights Project Permit, are required to be posted prior to the start of any work.

The Code Committee continues to process applications for exterior projects as quickly as possible. The expected time for review and approval is approximately two (2) weeks. We ask for your patience and your consideration of this timeline when planning all projects.

RESERVING A DATE FOR EVENTS, MEETINGS OR TRIPS

To reserve a room in one of our buildings for any event, meeting or when scheduling a trip, you must first contact the office for available dates. A Calendar Appointment Form must be completed for all reservations. The Recreation Chairperson and the Liaison Director for Recreation must approve all requests.

KITCHEN SIZE PLASTIC BAGS

Please be aware kitchen size plastic bags containing refuse are not allowed to be placed at the curb or stored on a Homeowners' property. Violations will result in fines. Please cooperate to help protect our community.

MAIL DROP BOX – For your convenience, when the office is closed, you can drop off your association dues payments or any other documents, in our convenient mail drop box located outside the front door to the Office Building.

EMERGENCY CONTACT INFORMATION

It is very important that the office has a valid phone number and an emergency contact number on file. If your information has changed, please call the office at 732-244-8686. It only takes a minute to update and it very well may save your life in case of an emergency!

RELOCATING-If you are planning on relocating to another address, selling your home, leaving your home vacant or have any other changes regarding your Homeowner status, please notify the office so your information can be updated in our master files.

GARAGE/ESTATE SALE PERMITS

As per the Berkeley Township Municipal Code: Chapter 5-7.4: "The assessed owner of a property may have two (2) garage or yard sales per year. Each

sale may not consist of more than two (2) consecutive days. A Berkeley Township permit is required to be obtained for each yard sale conducted. There is no fee for the first permit. There will be a five dollar (\$5.00) fee for the second permit. Permits are only available from the Berkeley Township Municipal Clerk."

NO DUMPING IN THE BASINS!

DUMPSTERS / PODS – Contact the Code Committee before planning to have a dumpster or storage pod placed in your driveway. Dumpsters and pods are not allowed on any street within the Holiday Heights Community.

SPEEDING IN OUR COMMUNITY

The speed limit is 25 MPH in residential areas. Those of you who have children living with you and who have the privilege of living here in our 55+ community are racing through our streets. Please tell them to **SLOW DOWN** and to **STOP AT STOP SIGNS**. Every day there are near misses in our community. It's not worth your life or someone else's life. **PLEASE SLOW DOWN!!**

<u>PARKING</u> - Commercial vehicles are not permitted in your driveway. Parking on your lawn is also not permitted.

<u>COMPLAINTS</u>-All complaints must be submitted in writing to the Code Committee with your name, address and signature. All written complaints will remain anonymous. You can obtain these forms from the Holiday Heights website or from the Association office.

CONTRACTOR SIGNS

No Contractor signs are to be left on lawns following completion of work.

CURBING YOUR PET-All pets must be confined within the Owner's Living Unit except when being walked on a hand-held leash, not to exceed six feet (6') in length. Pet Owners are permitted to use the easement/patch of grass between the sidewalk and the curb. Walking pets in the street is discouraged due to safety issues for Owners and pets. Pet Owners shall keep their pets off other Owners' properties, Clubhouse Grounds and Common Properties. All Pet Owners must collect their pet's feces. Failure to pick up after your pet is a Holiday Heights fineable offense for each occurrence. There will also be an additional fine for each infraction under the Berkeley Township Ordinance (05-25-OAB-3). We expect all Pet Owners to be respectful of other Owners and in return, we expect Owners to show the same respect for Pet Owners.

News from the Board By Lou Mangerpan

Soon a new set of governing documents will be released. One of the interesting items contained in the documents is a description of the various committees that help run the Association. Some have been around for some time, and a few are new to the Association. One of the new ones is the "Facilities" Committee.

While it is a new committee, it is an especially important committee. So, what does this new committee do, and why is it so important? The members (volunteers) of this committee are the eyes of the Association. They are the "caretakers" of the Association's facilities, buildings, grounds, and major components, which keep the facility running efficiently and cost effectively. They will monitor the maintenance measures that ensure safe and efficient operation of the clubhouses. They will be responsible for overseeing the maintenance and care of the clubhouses and all equipment. "Proactively" preserving the buildings, equipment and grounds will protect them from premature deterioration through monitoring the inspection, maintenance, and cleanliness of the facilities in accordance with the Association's Reserve Study and appropriate maintenance manual schedules. These volunteers will be inspecting all buildings and equipment monthly and report to the Buildings and Grounds Director any deficiencies, repair or replacement issues.

By proactively addressing issues we can extend the life of our buildings and equipment through timely maintenance and avoid unexpected repairs or replacement issues. It is always less costly to arrange for a "service" visit than a 'surprise" repair visit.

The Board is currently looking for volunteers (both male and female) to lead and participate in this committee. If you have any background in renovation, construction, electronics, plumbing, heating and ac repairs, and decor, please contact Rita Casteline at 732-244-8686 x 214. Commitment for this committee will not be involved in the actual repairs. It will require about a one hour per month walk through an assigned area based on your experience, skills or desires and report any observed issues. Actions by this committee will help keep the Association's expense under control.

Holiday Heights Homeowners' Association **Snow Removal Rules & Regs**

PLEASE BE PATIENT AS THERE ARE OVER 1,400 HOMES TO PLOW

- Berkeley Township Snow Ordinance (7-8.3) When Berkeley Township streets have become snow covered during snow storm emergency situations, it is unlawful to park vehicles on the streets until the snow has stopped and the roads have been cleared. Berkeley Township plowing will only be done after 5 inches of snow accumulation, a dusting of snow will not be plowed. Since many home driveways cannot accommodate more than one car, we suggest parking additional cars on your grass, next to your driveway, in order to clear the streets for the plows. There is a Berkeley Ordinance against parking on the lawn, but we have cleared it with the Berkeley Township Police Department and there will be no tickets issued for this during snow storms.
- Once Berkeley has plowed the streets, you should remove your car(s) from the driveway and front lawns, parking them in the street. Our contractor will not plow your driveway if there is a car parked there. All Aprons will be plowed. Aprons of homes on the No Plow list will be cleared.
- Our Contractor will start removing the snow after the streets are plowed by Berkeley Township and we are cleared to start.
- Driveways will be plowed starting 1 to 3 feet from the garage door. To prevent denting of garage doors, snow drifts against the doors should be removed prior to the driveway being plowed. Contractor will not be liable for damages.
- Contractor is not responsible for scratches or damage to driveways.
- Contractor is not responsible for any personal injury that may occur before, during or after snow removal.
- Contractor is not responsible for snow removal in front of the mailboxes.

WE ASK THAT EVERYONE PLEASE BE PATIENT!!!

Homeowners are responsible for clearing the sidewalks in front of their home. Complaints regarding clearing and damage to mailboxes should be directed to Berkeley Township (Do not call the office).

Plowing is done in the following order:

- 1. Clubhouse Pathway for plowing company staging area, emergency vehicles & Board members.
- 2. Clubhouse Parking Lotin case it needs to be used as a Homeowners-emergency shelter.
- 3. Residents homes

PROCEDURES FOR NOT PLOWING DRIVEWAYS- The HOA and Contractor will not be responsible for damage done to Designer Driveways.

As in prior years, you are required to come into the HOA office and sign a NO SNOW PLOW form, as your Homeowners' Association cannot be responsible for any damage to your driveway.

RIBBONSwill be issued for no-plow driveways. Ribbons can be obtained from the clubhouse office. It is your responsibility to place a ribbon on your mailbox or park your vehicle at the end of the driveway. Please do not use holiday decorations on or around your mailbox. The plow drivers must be able to see your ribbons clearly. If you fail to take the proper measures, your Association and the contractor will not be held responsible for any damages done to your driveway.

PLEASE NOTE:

The Association will not be responsible for damage done to designer driveways. If you want your designer driveway plowed, you must come into the office and sign a waiver.

ROBO CALL FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

- Q. My call gets cut off in the middle!
- A. Be sure to give the HOA Robo Calls "Caller ID" so that the call will be accepted and let it go directly to your voicemail. Extend the message allowed time to 3 minutes which is the length of the weekly calls. You will also be able to play back the call to listen to any parts you may have not heard clearly.
- Q. My calls get cut off as soon as I pick up the phone!
- A. Let your calls ring at least two times. If you pick up too quickly, you may disconnect the computerized cycle within the system.

Meeting Called to Order: 7:00

Homeowners: 71

Lou: Called the meeting to order with a flag salute and moment of silence followed by meeting protocols. RollCall - Directors in Attendance: Lou, Carol B., Dee, Tim, Carol H, George, Rita

Carol B. announced a new system for payment of the Association dues, which will now be by coupon page printed annually in the Courier. To help introduce it, just this year for the 2025 payments, a letter will be mailed with the coupons, as well as a sample page in the December Courier. Going forward coupons will only be made available in the December Courier of the preceding year. A motion was made; Seconded by Lou to participate in the NexTrex program for the collection of soft plastics for 12 months. Carolyn Onions questioned where the bins would be placed, and asked if the Association would see any monetary gains from participating and which items are accepted. Receptacles will be placed inside and outside of the clubhouses; clarification of acceptable items is printed on the box, no monetary gain other than a chance to win a Trex bench. Roll call vote, All in Favor. A motion was made, seconded by Lou for the Men's club request to replace some of the Holiday Lights not to exceed \$200. Roll call vote, All in Favor. A motion was made, seconded by Lou to place a toy collection box in the Clubhouse for Oceans of Love from November through mid-December. Roll catl vote, All in Favor

Lou motioned, Carol H. seconded for an emergency repair to the Entrance door to Building One not to exceed \$300. Roll call vote. All in Favor.

Dee read a synopsis and made a motion to approve, seconded by Lou for the minutes from the 9/26/24 Homeowner Meeting. Roll call vote, All in Favor. An update on the new Handbooks was made, anticipated completion and distribution by scheduled pick up in the auditorium by year's end. Lou added that the distribution will be on multiple days/evenings for everyone's convenience, probably by street, and it is all but mandatory, as not having a Handbook in your unit upon transfer the cost of one will be charged to the current Owner, not the new Owner. He also announced that the State of NJ has taken over the tree cutting policies, and they require permission for the cutting of all tress, and depending on the size of the tree, the replacement with a new tree on your property. Copies of the new Ordinance will be available in the office and the Code Committee is reviewing the same. Code Committee approval is always required and a permit must be visible in your window. Carolyn Onions asked removal of trees on the Common Grounds. The Association handles that.

Tim — Fiscal Year 2024-2025 Capital Reserve Fund Planned Expenditures


