CODE COMMITTEE

The Code Committee meets Monday mornings from 9:30AM-11:00AM in the Small Card Room (SCR) in the Office Building and are available to answer questions & provide guidance necessary for all exterior project requests. You can also call 732-244-8686 Ext.#220 and leave a message.

An approved Exterior Project Application Form, including all specifications necessary for the proposed project, as well as a Holiday Heights Project Permit are required before any work can begin. We continue to require approval for any exterior project before work begins. Please note: A Berkeley Township permit will be required when applicable. A copy of the Berkeley Township permit, as well as the Holiday Heights Project Permit, are required to be posted prior to the start of any work.

The Code Committee continues to process applications for exterior projects as quickly as possible. The expected time for review and approval is approximately two (2) weeks. We ask for your patience and your consideration of this timeline when planning all projects.

RESERVING A DATE FOR EVENTS, MEETINGS OR TRIPS

To reserve a room in one of our buildings for any event, meeting or when scheduling a trip, you must first contact the office for available dates. A Calendar Appointment Form must be completed for all reservations. The Recreation Chairperson and the Liaison Director for Recreation must approve all requests. KITCHEN SIZE PLASTIC BAGS

Please be aware kitchen size plastic bags containing refuse are not allowed to be placed at the curb or stored on Homeowners' property. Violations will result in fines. Please cooperate to help protect our community.

MAIL DROP BOX – For your convenience, when the office is closed, you can drop off your association dues payments or any other documents, in our convenient mail drop box located outside the front door to the Office Building.

EMERGENCY CONTACT INFORMATION

It is very important that the office has a valid phone number and an emergency contact number on file. If your information has changed, please call the office at 732-244-8686. It only takes a minute to update and it very well may save your life in case of an emergency!

RELOCATING-If you are planning on relocating to another address, selling your home, leaving your home vacant or have any other changes regarding your Homeowner status, please notify the office so your information can be updated in our master files.

GARAGE/ESTATE SALE PERMITS

As per the Berkeley Township Municipal Code: Chapter 5-7.4: "The assessed owner of a property may

have two (2) garage or yard sales per year. Each sale may not consist of more than two (2) consecutive days. A Berkeley Township permit is required to be obtained for each yard sale conducted. There is no fee for the first permit. There will be a fivedollar (\$5.00) fee for the second permit. Permits are only available from the Berkeley Township Municipal Clerk."

NO DUMPING IN THE BASINS!

DUMPSTERS / PODS – Contact the Code Committee before planning to have a dumpster or storage pod placed in your driveway. Dumpsters and pods are not allowed on any street within the Holiday Heights Community.

SPEEDING IN OUR COMMUNITY

The speed limit is **25 MPH** in residential areas. Those of you who have children living with you and who have the privilege of living here in our 55+ community are racing through our streets. Please tell them to **SLOW DOWN** and to **STOP AT STOP SIGNS**. Every day there are near misses in our community. It's not worth your life or someone else's life. **PLEASE SLOW DOWN!!**

<u>PARKING</u> - Commercial vehicles are not permitted in your driveway. Parking on your lawn is also not permitted.

<u>COMPLAINTS</u>-All complaints must be submitted in writing to the Code Committee with your name, address and signature. All written complaints will remain anonymous. You can obtain these forms from the Holiday Heights website or from the Association office.

CONTRACTOR SIGNS

No Contractor signs are to be left on lawns following completion of work.

CURBING YOUR PET-All pets must be confined within the Owner's Lot/Living Unit except when being walked on a hand-held leash, not to exceed six feet (6') in length. Pet Owners are permitted to use the easement/patch of grass between the sidewalk and the curb. Walking pets in the street is discouraged due to safety issues for Owners and pets. Pet Owners shall keep their pets off other Owners' properties, Clubhouse Grounds and Common Properties. **All Pet Owners must collect their pet's feces.** Failure to pick up after your pet is a Holiday Heights fineable offense for each occurrence. There will also be an additional fine for each infraction under the Berkeley Township Ordinance (05-25-OAB-3). We expect all Pet Owners to be respectful of other Owners and in return, we expect Owners to show the same respect for Pet Owners.

News from the Board by George Wilhelm

What is the color of snow? Translucent. When light reflects off it, snow appears white. The many sides of a snowflake scatter light, diffusing the color spectrum in many directions. Snow can look dark when dust, or pollution, covers it. Fresh-water algae that love snow can turn it into other colors like orange, blue, or watermelon pink.

Why is it so quiet after snow? Fresh snow cover dampens sound because it absorbs sound waves. If the snow melts, however, and then refreezes, the newly formed ice layer reflects sound waves, allowing sound to travel far and clear.

What is the Audio/Microphone system?

Our system has been recently upgraded. The new system consists of the sound booth, microphones, a new screen and projector, for use by clubs for events and activities. The volume of the system is controlled from the Audio Booth. There are handheld microphones and hanging microphones. The security is controlled to preserve the preset system settings, but each club/activity has two or more persons responsible for set up and quarterly maintenance performed by an approved contractor. Any input/changes require the Audio Liaison to be involved. Any questions contact a Director.

Holiday Heights Homeowners' Association Snow Removal Rules & Regs

PLEASE BE PATIENT AS THERE ARE OVER 1,400 HOMES TO PLOW

- <u>Berkeley Township Snow Ordinance (7-8.3)</u> When Berkeley Township streets have become snow
 covered during snow storm emergency situations, it is unlawful to park vehicles on the streets until the snow
 has stopped and the roads have been cleared. Berkeley Township plowing will only be done after 5 inches of
 snow accumulation, a dusting of snow will not be plowed. Since many home driveways cannot accommodate
 more than one car, we suggest parking additional cars on your grass, next to your driveway, in order to clear
 the streets for the plows. There is a Berkeley Ordinance against parking on the lawn, but we have cleared it
 with the Berkeley Township Police Department and there will be no tickets issued for this during snow storms.
- Once Berkeley has plowed the streets, you should remove your car(s) from the driveway and front lawns, parking them in the street. Our contractor will not plow your driveway if there is a car parked there. All Aprons will be plowed. Aprons of homes on the No Plow list will be cleared.
- Our Contractor will start removing the snow after the streets are plowed by Berkeley Township and we are cleared to start.
- Driveways will be plowed starting 1 to 3 feet from the garage door. To prevent denting of garage doors, snow
 drifts against the doors should be removed prior to the driveway being plowed. Contractor will not be liable
 for damages.
- · Contractor is not responsible for scratches or damage to driveways.
- · Contractor is not responsible for any personal injury that may occur before, during or after snow removal.
- · Contractor is not responsible for snow removal in front of the mailboxes.

WE ASK THAT EVERYONE PLEASE BE PATIENT !!!

• Homeowners are responsible for clearing the sidewalks in front of their home. Complaints regarding clearing and damage to mailboxes should be directed to Berkeley Township (Do not call the office).

- If you need emergency transportation call Berkeley Police @ 732-341-6600
- If you have a life-threatening situation, call 911.

Plowing is done in the following order:

- 1. Clubhouse Pathway for plowing company staging area, emergency vehicles & Board members.
- 2. Clubhouse Parking Lot in case it needs to be used as a Homeowners-emergency shelter.
- 3. Residents homes

PROCEDURES FOR NOT PLOWING DRIVEWAYS – The HOA and Contractor will not be responsible for damage done to Designer Driveways.

 As in prior years, you are required to come into the HOA office and sign a NO SNOW PLOW form, as your Homeowners' Association cannot be responsible for any damage to your driveway.

<u>**RIBBONS**</u> will be issued for no-plow driveways. Ribbons can be obtained from the clubhouse office. It is your responsibility to place a ribbon on your mailbox or park your vehicle at the end of the driveway. Please do not use holiday decorations on or around your mailbox. The plow drivers must be able to see your ribbons clearly. If you fail to take the proper measures, your Association and the contractor will not be held responsible for any damages done to your driveway.

PLEASE NOTE:

 The Association will not be responsible for damage done to designer driveways. If you want your designer driveway plowed, you must come into the office and sign a waiver.



Holiday Heights Annual Meeting November 14, 2024

Meeting Called to Order: 7:12 Homeowners: 301

Lou: Called the meeting to order with a flag salute and moment of silence followed by meeting protocols. RollCall - Directors in Attendance: Lou, Carol B., Dee, Tim, Carol H, George, Rita

Lou spoke about two new Committees he is seeking volunteers to Chair; Facilities and Civics. The Facilities Committee will act as a caretaker of the Association's facilities, buildings and grounds and monitor for safety and efficient use of the facilities proactively to preserve the buildings, equipment and grounds from premature deterioration by performing monthly inspections and reporting any deficiencies. The schedule will be in a maintenance manual. The committee will also follow the recommendations of the Reserve Study. Anyone with a background in facilities, we are seeking a Chairperson and 5 or so Committee people.

The Civics Committee, a Chairperson to monitor the federal, state, and local legislative updates pertinent to our community and services provided by off-site entities, and bring matters of interest to our community for the improvement, welfare and safety of the Association. Also to attend Township Council meetings delivering issues of interest to the Community.

Carol B. spoke about the new system for payment of the Association dues, which will now be by coupon page printed annually in the Courier. The letter, with a one-time addition of the coupons, will be mailed on November 22, with a sample of the coupons in the December Courier. Going forward coupons will only be made available in the December Courier of the preceding year.

Dee read a synopsis and made a motion to approve, seconded by Lou for the minutes from the 10/24/24 Annual Homeowner Meeting. Roll call vote, All in Favor. An update on the new Handbooks was made, anticipated to be at the printer in December and distribution by scheduled pick up in the auditorium in January.

Tim read the financial report for the month ending 10/31/24. Operating month ending 9/30/24 \$101,916.23 - 10/31/24 \$107,617.48; Money Market (4.25%) month ending 9/30/24 \$171,552.91 - 10/31/24 \$172,028.79; CD 9/30/24 & 10/31/24 \$100,000.00 - interest to be paid at maturity (5%) Capital Reserve month ending 9/30/24 \$34,011.82 - 10/31/24 \$26,711.37; Cap. Walkways and sidewalks are the responsibility of the Homeowner. Two new benches have been ordered to replace those in disrepair. The home on Chesterfield has been taken care of.

Rita is seeking a volunteer to lead a group here for the Volunteers of Central New Jersey. They match volunteers with Residents in need for help with shopping, respite for caregivers, pet therapy, phone calls, small handyman jobs (light bulbs, filters, etc.) to those needing such assistance.

The meeting broke for the presentation of the Mayor/DPW discussing the new Robo Can program coming to Holiday Heights. The program is being implemented to save money and cut down on Workers Comp claims, also saving the Township money. Cans were brought for viewing. Recipe

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
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
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
