CODE COMMITTEE

The Code Committee meets Monday mornings from 9:30AM -11:00AM in the Small Card Room (SCR) in the Office Building and are available to answer questions & provide guidance necessary for all exterior project requests. You can also call 732-244-8686 Ext.#220 and leave a message.

We continue to require approval for any exterior project before work begins.

An approved Exterior Project Application Form, including all specifications necessary for the proposed project, as well as a Holiday Heights Project Permit are required before any work can begin. Please note: A Berkeley Township permit will be required when applicable. A copy of the Berkeley Township permit, as well as the Holiday Heights Project Permit, are required to be posted prior to the start of any work. The Code Committee continues to process applications for exterior projects as quickly as possible. The expected time for review and approval is approximately two (2) weeks. We ask for your patience and your consideration of this timeline when planning all projects.

Complaint Notices

"All complaints must be submitted in writing, including your name, address and signature, to the Code Committee.

All complaints must include photos of the violation.

"concerned neighbors"

will not be accepted."

RESERVING A DATE FOR EVENTS, MEETINGS OR TRIPS

To reserve a room in one of our buildings for any event, meeting or when scheduling a trip, you must first contact the office for available dates. A Calendar Appointment Form must be completed for all reservations. The Recreation Chairperson and the Liaison Director for Recreation must approve all requests.

KITCHEN SIZE PLASTIC BAGS

Please be aware kitchen size plastic bags containing refuse are not allowed to be placed at the curb or stored on Homeowners' property. Violations will result in fines. Please cooperate to help protect our community.

RELOCATING- If you are planning on relocating to another address, selling your home, leaving your home vacant or have any other changes regarding your Homeowner status, please notify the office so your information can be updated in our master files.

GARAGE/ESTATE SALE PERMITS

As per the Berkeley Township Municipal Code: Chapter 5-7.4: "The assessed owner of a property may have two (2) garage or yard sales per year. Each sale may not consist of more than two (2) consecutive days. A Berkeley Township permit is required to be obtained for each yard sale

conducted. There is no fee for the first permit. There will be a five dollar (\$5.00) fee for the second permit. Permits are only available from the Berkeley Township Municipal Clerk."

HOMEOWNER STATUS UPDATES:

It is very important that the office is notified of the following so we can update your master file accordingly:

- 1. Change of marital status-(deceased spouse or divorce).
- 2. New Residents that have joined your household.
- 3. Valid phone number and an emergency contact number.
- 4. Email address-(one is required per household). It only takes a minute to update your records and we encourage you to do so.

The office staff is available to assist you during office hours

NO DUMPING IN THE BASINS!

<u>DUMPSTERS / PODS</u> – Contact the Code Committee before planning to have a dumpster or storage pod placed in your driveway. Dumpsters and pods are not allowed on any street within the Holiday Heights Community.

SPEEDING IN OUR COMMUNITY

The speed limit is 25 MPH in residential areas. Those of you who have children living with you and who have the privilege of living here in our 55+ community are racing through our streets. Please tell them to **SLOWDOWN** and to **STOP AT STOP SIGNS**. Every day there are near misses in our community. It's not worth your life or someone else's life. **PLEASE SLOW DOWN!!**

PARKING - Commercial vehicles are not permitted in your driveway. Parking on your lawn is also not permitted.

CONTRACTOR SIGNS

No Contractor signs are to be left on lawns following completion of work.

CURBING YOUR PET-All pets must be confined within the Owner's Lot/Living Unit except when being walked on a hand-held leash, not to exceed six feet (6') in length. Pet Owners are permitted to use the easement/patch of grass between the sidewalk and the curb. Walking pets in the street is discouraged due to safety issues for Owners and pets. Pet Owners shall keep their pets off other Owners' properties, Clubhouse Grounds and Common Properties. All Pet Owners must collect their pet's feces. Failure to pick up after your pet is a Holiday Heights fineable offense for each occurrence. There will also be an additional fine for each infraction under the Berkeley Township Ordinance (05-25-OAB-3). We expect all Pet Owners to be respectful of other Owners and in return, we expect Owners to show the same respect for Pet Owners.

Homeowner Handbook 2025- Rules & Regulations Article IV-Restrictions & Enforcements

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5. Domestic Pets and Wildlife

- a) All animals except domesticate pets are prohibited. Domestic pets shall be confined within the Lot/Living Unit except while being walked on a hand-held leash which is not to exceed six feet (6') in length.
- b) Pet owners and keepers are permitted to use the easement/patch of grass between the sidewalk and the curb (Ref. Berkeley Township Ordinance No. 84-1-OAB § 9-2.5). Walking pets in the street is discouraged due to safety issues for people and pets.
- c) Pet owners and keepers shall keep their pets off other Owners' Lots and all Common Properties and immediately and properly dispose of their pet's solid waste. (Ref. Berkeley Township Ordinance No. 05-25-OAB § 3). Solid waste must **not** be emptied into sewers or basins.
- d) All pet owners shall immediately collect their pet's solid waste, even on their own Lots.
- e) Owners and/or Residents shall not feed wildlife since doing so can pose a nuisance to neighbors and can spread ticks and disease (Ref. Berkeley Township Ordinance No. 00-2 OAB § 4). Wildlife shall not be fed with the exception of the use of off-ground bird feeders placed so as not to impede the Association's lawn service and placed as to not allow access by any unintended animals.

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14. Lawns, Landscaping, Shrubs & Trees

A Berkeley Township permit is required for the removal of trees. 7 feet/4 ½ inches in diameter. Any tree removed is required to have the stump removed or ground down.

All plans to remove add to or change any Lot landscaping on or near a Lot's property line, including additions of hardscapes, must be submitted to and approved in writing by the Code Committee/Board. A Berkeley Township Zoning Permit and possibly a Grading Exception Certification may also be required prior to any work commencing. Any removal, addition or change to a Lot's landscaping/hardscapes must not interfere with the Association's lawn service.

- a) A mature grass lawn is required and must be well maintained on the front, rear, and sides of all Lots and not excessively watered as to impede or prevent the Association's lawn service.
- b) It shall be unlawful for any person, corporation or entity to throw, deposit, sweep or otherwise cause to be put onto the surface of any street or avenue of the Township any leaves, grass sweepings, litter, broken glass, metal, wood, dirt or any other refuse or debris. (Ref. Berkeley Township Ordinance No. 17-3.8).
- c) No plantings or obstacles are allowed in the swales, and side-lot landscaping, including borders and blocks adjacent to the Living Unit must not exceed eighteen inches (18") in height except to accommodate sloping grounds. Total landscaping may not extend more than two feet (2') from the side of the Living Unit. Any plantings deemed to create or contribute to a drainage problem must be removed.
- d) Front landscaping, including shrubs, borders, and blocks, is permitted; blocks and/or borders are not to exceed eighteen inches (18") in height and total landscaping cannot extend more than four feet (4') from the front of the Living Unit or front porch, if applicable.

A tree may be planted in the front yard. Branches must be kept trimmed to a height of seven feet (7') from the ground and shall not protrude over sidewalks as to pose a danger to walkers.

e) For rear Lot lines, shrubs must be planted a minimum of three feet (3') in from the rear Lot line, and spaced three feet (3') on center. Trees planted at the rear Lot line must be planted a minimum of five feet (5') from the rear Lot line and spaced five feet (5') on center so as shrubs and trees shall not grow beyond an Owner's Lot lines.

Additions to the Holiday Heights Rules and Regulations

Amended- May 2025

Under Article IV, Section 4, Schedule of Fines

HOPA FORM COMPLETION

Failure to submit a completed HOPA form with the required documentation showing proof of address and age, the HOPA form not being received by the due date, or any misrepresentation of the information required will result in a five hundred dollar fine (\$500.00) as per the Holiday Heights resolution dated December 6, 2022.

ACCESS CARD USAGE

Owners and Residents who lend an Access Card to another individual for the purpose of gaining access to a room or location, or who swipe an Access Card to allow another individual to gain access to a room or location will be fined fifty dollars (\$50.00) for the first offense and fifty dollars (\$50.00) and loss of Membership privileges for three (3) months for each additional offense.

LOST ACCESS CARDS

Owners and Residents who lose an Access Card will be charged twenty five dollars (\$25.00) for each replacement card.

E-BIKES

Failure to correct or repeated violations of the E-Bike requirements as per Article IV,, Section 1, Number 24, Vehicles and Bicycles, see new amendment letter F, will result in an initial fine of fifty dollars (\$50.00) and twenty five dollars (\$25.00) each day thereafter.

Under Article IV, Section 1, Use and Property Restrictions, Number 24, Vehicles and Bicycles-new letter F.

F-E-BIKES

E-Bikes shall be allowed on Clubhouse grounds, must be walked on non-vehicular areas, and must only be stationed in the designated racks provided, away from clubhouse buildings. They are not to be laid, leaned or placed anywhere else on Clubhouse grounds.

GRASS CUTTING POLICY

Sprinkler heads are the Owner's responsibility

All Grass Cutting Issues must be reported to the HOA Office in writing, using the Lawn Complaint Form (forms are available at the HOA Office or on our website at (holidayheights.org). Please do not call the Lawn Contractor or a Director. A complaint form must be filled out for all complaints. If no complaint form is filled out the complaint will be voided.

Damage to property such as siding, fences, borders and sprinklers will be addressed in a timely manner. Our contractor has staff to handle these repairs. Should you have damage, please take responsible measures to prevent further damage. All complaints will be inspected by a director to determine the cause and action to be taken. Repairs made by homeowners prior to the Director's inspection and without authorization by the Board, will not be reimbursed. Please ensure the cutters have a clear path and your sprinkler heads are down on grass cutting days. Sprinkler heads damaged due to headsbeing raised during the cut cycle will not be repaired by the Lawn Contractor. If you have heads that do not retract, place red do-not cut flags around the head until you can have it repaired, also confirm all ground panels are secured.

Damage to lawns such as scalping and ruts will be considered on a <u>case-by-case</u> basis. Some will grow back without intervention. The majority of ruts are caused by the ground being over saturated due to recent rain and/or over watering by the sprinklers. The driver is most likely unaware of the saturated ground until it is too late. Ruts caused by Homeowners over watering their lawn will not be repaired by the Lawn Contractor. Please check your side and rear yards as needed to ensure the ground is not over saturated. If you find there are areas that are over saturated, please obtain red flags from the HOA Office and circle the saturated areas so the mowers know not to cut that area.

No Cut Signs are a violation and are subject to a fine if placed on your lawn.

"No Cut" flags are available in the HOA Office for those not wanting the Association to cut their grass. You will need to fill out the No Lawn Cut form and you will be given flags at the HOA Office. If you change your mind and decide you want your lawn cut, please remove the flags.

Under normal soil conditions, grass requires only ½ to 1 inch of water per week. Our soils are generally wetter due to the high-water table and type of soil; therefore, discuss this with your sprinkler contractor and ask them to adjust the frequency and run times on your sprinkler system for roughly ¾ inch per week. Also ask them to adjust your system as needed throughout the watering season. Remember the water requirements for the area between the homes may be less than the front and back, work with your neighbors to establish a watering schedule. Watering your lawn every day is not needed unless it is a new seeding.



A SHOUT OUT TO: Carlos Santiago

ave you ever had the opportunity to interview a person of interest? If so, you would know that you have to be prepared with a list of pertinent, perhaps even some mundane, questions that would make for an interesting piece! So, in getting ready to sit with Carlos to discuss his Neighborhood Watch Program, I came equipped with my trusty notepad and a barrage of questions for him! However, after one or two questions, the floodgates were opened and out came a story of a man who wants to do good and has lived his life as a witness to his goodness.

Carlos came to us three years ago with his wife from Barnegat by way of Rahway. Although he was very modest regarding resurrecting the Neighborhood Watch Program, he was able to be nudged into sharing his benevolent presence with our Holiday Heights Community. Carlos is presently a school bus driver for the Toms River School District (chauffeuring students, some with special needs, from pre-kindergarten to Grade 12) and he performs his job with patience, fairness, firmness, and consistency. His preparation for this job began a long time ago.

Carlos began his career as a State Correctional Police officer, and it wasn't long before he became a Seargent. He was also a firearms instructor. For six years he worked as an armed school safety security guard. This led us to the topic of school shootings and arming teachers in the classroom, a sensitive issue that has come to the public's attention. The classroom is not a place for guns. Guns should not be in the hands of amateurs, nor could they possibly be kept in a safe place and still be accessible in a moment's notice at the same time.

So, it became apparent as to why overseeing the

Neighborhood Watch Program piqued his interest. And his passion was the impetus for the rebirth of the program. This is when he created his Facebook page where he posts safety tips and encourages our residents to follow the motto "if you see something, say something." Remember the picture of the bearded man going from one mailbox to the next opening each one as he approached? That was the work of one of residents who spotted him on a Ring camera and reported it. It's as easy as view, save, download, and share. At meetings Carlos instructs people on how to gather information. For example, what looks suspicious about this scene? His astuteness pointed out how, strangely enough, the man's picture on his business card looked more like a police sketch than an actual photo of the man with a legitimate business. Of course, Carlos adamantly encourages us not to confront any situation, but to call the police.

His meetings are important. They keep open communication with each other and with the police. It doesn't hurt to have a safe community either, which attracts potential buyers and raises property value. Very clever incite, Carlos!

Last season the Berkeley Police Department donated the Neighborhood Watch signs to Holiday Heights. He has also had attendance by the Ocean County Fire Marshall and the Red Cross. Smoke detectors were donated to us and Carlos volunteered to assist in their installation. However, in his spare time he enjoys gardening, fishing, attending Social Club meetings, and doing small side-jobs for his neighbors. You may also see him biking in the neighborhood. Even though he is not patrolling, feel free to stop him if you have anything to report! He also maintains close contact with John Abella who keeps us informed on his website as well.

So, what do you say, Holiday Heights?!! Let's support Carlos and thank him for keeping us informed and safe by attending his meetings. Neighborhood Watch meets every other month on the first Wednesday. His first meeting of the new season will be held on October 8th. Kelly Wenzel, who owns the Hovnanian Sanctuary behind Canterbury and Prince Charles, will come to discuss the prospects of the property, and you can be sure he has an interesting lineup to the new season!

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HOLIDAY HEIGHTS FIRST AID SQUAD

The Holiday Heights First Aid Squad was formed in 1987 to serve the residents of Holiday Heights. We currently work a 12-hour shift from 7 am until 1900 (7 pm). The days we work are Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday & Thursday.

Each crew consists of an EMT or Certified Assessor, a driver/ lifter and an information specialist. Both of our ambulances are equipped with hydraulic stretchers that lift the patient into the ambulance.

There are 3 requirements to become a squad member: having a valid driver's license, getting CPR certified, and being able to get on and off the ambulance unassisted.

All crew members are certified in CPR and the use of an AED. Classes are provided in the squad

building, and all costs are covered by the squad. Members that want to be certified as an Assessor or EMT may take the required class at no cost. Drivers attend a CIVO or Advance Emergency Drivers class. Additionally, there are other classes offered by the town or County, and attendance is voluntary.

Uniform shirts and jackets are provided by the Squad. You will need black pants and black shoes.

Most Crews work two or three days per month, and we also have one mandatory meeting per month, usually the fourth Wednesday of the month.
